#### **Energy questions**

Public Service Co. of New Hampshire ducked the bullet last week, but its Northern Pass hydroelectric project isn't out of the woods yet.

Lobbyists for PSNH furiously tried to convince the House Science, Technology and Energy Committee to kill legislation that would block any eminent domain takings for the massive transmission effort that would bring high-altitude lines from the Canadian border to Rockingham County.

The panel wasn't about to do that, but they did the next best thing from PSNH's perspective, agreeing to retain the bill on a 13-5 vote.

O'Brien assured committee members that he wants the bill to pass, but that the language needs more legal work.

Whatever his desires, the House leader is hemmed in by the 2010 campaign in which state GOP leaders made the protection of property rights a major campaign plank.

### **Does Northern Pass Know How Many Properties must be "Taken"?**

This email from Tom Duggan sent to Darlene King sent with his permission to share with others. It is another testimony on what was observed at the House Committee on Science, Technology and Energy on March 9<sup>th</sup> for HB648 and HB649. This is in regards to eminent domain and what Northern Pass knows.

Tom's message below sent via Darlene King:

"Thanks for your write-up. I was there yesterday as well and generally agree with your observations. One thing that stuck in my mind was just how shameless these people are when they claim to not have information about something. Consider this:

"We are all at the State House to debate a bill that would restrict their ability to

take land by Eminent Domain. During the course of the Northern Pass testimony, they had multiple attorneys with experience in power projects testify about the state and federal permitting process, they had testimony showing expensive computer generated simulations of how the power lines would look on one person's land, they went on at length about the history of PSNH and how they can't remember the last time they had to use eminent domain... easily over an hour of combined blather. All of this from the company that has spent 2 years and millions of dollars studying and planning this project. However, when asked one very simple question that is absolutely at the core of the issue being discussed - "In order to build this project, how many properties would potentially have to be taken by eminent domain?" they stared blankly back and claimed to have no idea.

"The answer is hundreds and they know it. They know the exact number in each of the towns on each of the routes. They know the historical property values, the current property values, and the projected property values for when they take them. They have to - that number HAS to be accounted for in the project cost up front otherwise they'd never be able to sell this thing to their investors. The reality is that they probably know more about every one of the properties than the owners do. To claim that they don't even know how many there are is Absolutely Shameless.
